This year’s “Excelencia” awardees are:

Keystone Award: Awarded to an individual who has contributed in an extraordinary way to the Hispanic community during the course of his/her professional career. This year's honoree is Hon. Nelson Díaz, the first Latino to be admitted to the Pennsylvania Bar Association and later become the first Latino judge in the state. In the course of his career, he has helped to organize several institutions with the purpose of advancing the Latino community.

Hispanic Business of the Year Award: Awarded to the Hispanic business that has distinguished itself from the competition through overall excellence and high-quality standards. This year’s recipient is Marquis & Co., founded by Nicole Marquis. It is a group of vegan restaurants, including the popular Hip City Veg, created with the goal of showing that vegan food can be plentiful and delicious.

Hispanic Professional of the Year Award: Awarded to an outstanding professional in the Latino community for his/her career accomplishments. This award is given to Dr. Damian Fernandez, Chancellor of Penn State, Abington, who is among the 4% of Latinos who lead colleges and universities across the country.
